

Stephenson in his last Will and Testament to Hannah G. Barrett (who was his wife, of the said Davis Barrett) and known as the "Underwood" the line to commence at Abner Stephenson's Corner and run as the description of said Land and information relating to said Land reference which was received in the last Will and Testament of the said Anne Stephenson on the 30th day of July 1840.

And the said Davis Barrett covenants with the said Ed. Callahan Barrett and L. Admus Barrett that he will warrant generally the right and title of said property hereby conveyed.

This Deed of Bargain and Sale was acknowledged by Davis Barrett a party thereto and admitted to record.

This Deed made the 23rd day of November in the year 1860, Between Jeremiah E. Joyner of the one part & William Britton of the other part, Doth grant unto the said William Britton the following property, one negro man Elisha, 4 feather beds, 4 furniture with all other house hold & kitchen furniture, 2 horses, cattle, hogs, sheep and stock of all description & their increase one Buggy, Saddy, with their harness, also this crop of all description, Corn, fodder, peas, &c. and farming utensils of every description. In trust to secure Patrick Dolan in Debt of certain Bonds as follows; - One bond of one hundred & ten Dollars due the 10th of May, 1860, one ditto one hundred & ten Dollars due the 20th Sept 1860, one of Thirty Dollars due 23rd of October 1860, one of Fifty Six Dollars due 23rd of November 1860, The above obligations are such that if the said Jeremiah E. Joyner should pay the above bonds with interest accruing therefrom when demanded, then the above obligations shall be null & void otherwise they shall remain in full force and the said William Britton shall after giving ten days notice proceed to sell for cash the abovenamed property and pay first the expenses accruing therefrom then to Patrick Dolan the abovenamed Bonds with interest and the remainder, if any, pay to the said Jeremiah E. Joyner.
