And the said Rebecca Story warrants generally the property hereby conveyed.

This Deed made this seventeenth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred and eighty, between John M. Gurley of the first part and W. H. Hedley of the other part, Witnesses; that the said Gurley for and in consideration of the sum of one hundred Dollars to him paid by the said Hedley the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged doth grant and convey to the said Hedley all that tract or parcel of land lying near "Potterway Mills" supposed to contain thirty acres more or less, which said parcel of land is known as "Gurley's Island" and is bounded on the North and East by the lands attached to the said "Potterway Mills" and on the South and west by Stark M. Bishop's land and a Potterway river. that is to say, the said Island is separated from the Mill property on the North and East and from Stark M. Bishop's on the South and East by a creek or cove called Story's Gut and is bounded on the west by the said Potterway river.

And the said Gurley warrants generally the property hereby conveyed.
