This Indenture made the seventh Day of July one Thousand seven hundred and Sixty in the first Year of the reign of our Sovereign Lord King George the Third Between Joseph Lark of Southampton County in the Colony of Virginia of the one Part and James Westbrooke of the County aforesaid of the other Part Witnesseth that the s^d Joseph Lark for and in consideration of the sum of Eighteen Pounds Current Money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the s^d James Westbrooke at and before the Enacting and Delivery hereof the Receipt whereof the s^d Joseph Lark Doth hereby Acknowledge and thereof Doth Acquit the s^d James Westbrooke his Heirs Executors and Administrators that he Granted Bargained Sold Aligned Released and Confirmed and by these Presents Doth Grant Bargain Sell Aligned Release and Confirm unto the s^d James Westbrooke his Heirs & assigns forever one certain Tract Parcel or Dividend of Land situate lying & being in the County aforesaid containing by Estimation Two Hundred Acres of Land more or less and bounded as followeth (to wit) Beginning at a Maple on a small Branch a corner Tree of Edward Matthews's Land then up the School house Branch to a Turkey Oak in the head thereof thence North forty two Degrees East Eighty Eight Pole to a Pine a corner of W^m Johnsons Land then along his lines South thirty seven Degrees East one hundred & fifty Pole to a Red Oak by the side of Johnsons Fence thence South thirty Degrees East one hundred & Twenty Pole to a Pine thence North fifty five Degrees East Sixty two Pole to a Pine on Georges Branch to a small Gum in John Turners line then along his lines South Thirty one Degrees East one hundred and sixteen Pole to a Red Oak a corner of s^d Westbrookes other Land then along his lines South Seventy Nine Degrees West forty Pole to a Pine North Thirty five Degrees West Twenty Pole to a Hickory then South Seventy Nine Degrees West to a Pine a corner of Edw^d Matthews's Land then by a line of Mark Trees to the Beginning Together with all Houses out Houses & edifices Buildings woodways
