This Indenture Tripartite made the tenth Day of Sept in the first Year of the
 reign of our Sovereign Lord George the third now King of Great Britain &c and in the Year
 of our Lord Christ one thousand Seven hundred & sixty Between George Skipper & William
 Pearce Chief Men of the Nottoway Indian Nation of the first part Joseph Gray W^m Taylor
 and Howell Edmunds of the County of Southampton Gent of the second part and James
 Moore of the said County of Southampton of the third part Whereas by an Act of
 Assembly made in the twenty ninth Year of his Majesty's Reign entitled An Act to enable
 the Nottoway Indians to sell certain Lands and for other purposes therein mentioned the
 Chief Men of the said Nottoway Indian Nation where improved by and with the Consent and
 Approbation of the said Joseph Gray W^m Taylor & Howell Edmunds the Survivors or Survivor of them
 Trustees therein named to see said Act duly executed to sell at a Credit not exceeding twelve Months
 and convey that part of the said Indians Land as lay on the East Side of Buckhorn Swamp & the
 south side of Buckhorn Road to the Eastern & Southern boundary of their Tract of Six Miles
 Square containing about five thousand Acres for the best price that could be got and after any
 Agreement made for the Sale of the same or any Part thereof it is by the said Act directed Lawful
 for the Chief Men of the said Nation together with the Trustees aforesaid or the Survivor or Survivors
 of them to Seal & Deliver any Deed or Deeds indented for the Conveyance of the Fee simple
 and Inheritance of the said Lands to the Purchaser upon his entering into Bond with good Security
 for the payment of the Purchase Money to the said Trustees for the Use & Purposes in the said
 Act expressed And Whereas the said James Moore for the Consideration of fifty seven
 Pounds ten Shillings for the payment whereof he hath entered into Bond with good Security
 hath Purchased five hundred and sixty eight Acres of the said Tract of the said Chief
 Men of the said Indian Nation with the Consent and Approbation of the said Trustees in
 two distinct parcels and Described in the Surveyors plots thereof by the numbers 2 and 6.
 N^o 2 containing Two hundred & forty Acres and bounded as followeth (to Wit)
 Beginning at a small Pine in John Thomas's Line Corner to N^o 1 thence North 46 Degrees
 West 170 poles to a small Black Oak thence South West 310 poles to a Red Oak on Barrows
 Road a Corner of N^o 4 & 5 thence Down the various Courses of the said Road to a Black Oak
 a Corner of John Thomas's Land thence along his line to the Beginning N^o 6 containing three hundred
 and twenty eight Acres & bounded as followeth to Wit Beginning at a Black Oak a Corner of N^o
 14 & 15 on Barrows Road thence up the various of the said Road to a Pine standing
 in the Head of Blunt's Swamp thence down the said Swamp to a small sweet gum
 Corner of N^o 7 thence South East 272 poles to a pine Corner of N^o 12 & 13 thence North
 East 166 poles to a Red Oak thence North thirty three Degrees East 101 poles to the Beginning
 Now this Indenture therefore Witnesseth that the Chief Men of the said Nottoway
 Indian Nation with the Consent of the said Trustees testified by there being made

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
