This Indenture made this 5th Day of November in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty one Between Benjamin Best of North Carolina and County Dobbs of the one Part and William Briant Jun^r of Virginia & City of Southampton of the other Part Witnesseth that the s^d Benj^r Best for in consideration of the Sum of five Pounds Curr^t Money of Virginia to him in hand Paid by the said W^m Briant the Receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge he the s^d Benj^r Best doth hereby Acquit and Discharge hath granted bargained Sold & by these Presents do grant Bargain Sell alien & conform unto the s^d W^m Briant his heirs & assigns one certain Tractor Parcel of Land Lying in Virg^a and City of Southampton on the South side of Nottoway River and on the North side of the Cyprus swamp containing one hundred and fifty Acres & Bounded as followeth To Wit Beginning at a Live Oak on the North side of the Cyprus Swamp thence North fifty Degrees East one hundred & eight Poles to a Red Oak thence East seventy two Poles to a white Oak a line Tree of Whitehead. Land thence by Whiteheads Lines South thirty five Degrees East fifty Poles to a Pine & North Seventy degrees East seven Poles to a Pine thence South fifty degrees East one hundred & twelve Poles to a Pine thence Southwest by South forty Poles to three Red Oaks formerly a Corner of William Turners Land and now Nicholas
