At a court for the County of Southampton the 14 day of October 1762.

This indenture and the receipt endorsed were proved by the oaths of John Gilliam
Charles Barham and Richard Johnson the witnesses thereto and ordered to be
recorded.

This Indenture made this 25 day of July in the second year of the reign
of our sovereign Lord George the Third by the grace of god ^{King} of Great Britain France and Ireland
King defender of the faith &c. and in the year of our Lord Christ 1762. Between
William Jones of the county of Southampton of the one part and Thomas Tynes of the
county of Isle of Wight of the other part Witnesseth that the said William Jones
for and in consideration of the sum of eighty pounds current money of Virginia in
hand paid by the said Thomas Tynes on or before the sealing and delivery of
these presents the receipt whereof the said Wm Jones hath thereof acquit and dis-
charged the said Thomas Tynes hath granted bargained sold aliened conveyed &
confirmed by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien convey and confirm
unto the said Thomas Tynes to him and his heirs forever all that certain tract or parcel
of land lying and being in the aforesaid county of Southampton containing three
hundred and fifteen acres be the same more or less it being all and every part of the
land the said Wm Jones bought of William Crumpler and John Crumpler as may
appear by deeds granted to the said Jones on the 25 day of November 1751. the other
the 25th of January 1762. and recorded in the court of the aforesaid county of Southampton
and bounded as followeth to wit at a place called tickers neck bar black
water joining William Crumplers land thence along the said line to a pine corner
tree of Benjamin Crumplers line thence by the said line to a white corner tree of J^r
Wrights line from thence to a pine standing in a meadow thence by the said Wrights
line aforesaid to a red oak and by the said Wrights line to a white oak corner tree
of Joseph Powells line then by Powells line to Mores line thence by Mores line to a
line called the old line to a white oak at the head of a small branch joining the lands
of John Crumpler &c. thence by Mores line to a branch near the said Crumplers
old field down the branch to Kings spring on black water & down the various courses
