This Indenture made the tenth day of march in the third year of the reign of our sovereign lord George the third by the grace of god of great brittain France & Ireland being defender of the faith &c and in the year of our lord chrest one thousand seven hundred and sixty three Between John Morgan jun^r of St Lukes parish in the county of Southampton of the one part and John Rease of the parish and City of the other part We the better that the said John Morgan Jun^r for sin consideration of the sum of fifty pounds current money of Virginia to the said In^r Morgan jun^r in hand paid by the said In^r Rease the receipt whereof he the said In^r Morgan jun^r doth hereby acknowledge he the said In^r Morgan jun^r doth grant bargain and sell alien and confirm unto the said John Rease his heirs and assigns forever all that certain tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the ^{parish of} ~~city~~ ^{and parishes} of the north side of three creeks containing by estimation one hundred & five acres be the same more less and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a black Jack a corner tree between John Johnson Henry Applewhite and the said In^r Morgan jun^r thence along the line between Henry Applewhite & the said Morgan to an Elm near the northern end of the three creeks a corner tree between Henry Applewhite Edward Rease & the said Morgan thence along the said Ed^r Reases line to his corner white oak then along the said Reases line to another white oak... thence along the said Reases line to his corner red oak in the aforesaid Henry Applewhite line thence along the said Applewhite line to the black Jack begun at and all houses buildings orchards lands and advantages whatsoever to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in anywise appertaining and also all the estate right title interest property claim and demand whatsoever of him the said In^r Morgan jun^r of in and to the same To have & to hold the said tract or parcel of land & premises with the appurtenances unto the John Rease his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use & behoof of him the said In^r Rease his heirs and assigns forever and the said In^r Morgan jun^r the said tract or parcel of land & premises with the appurtenances to the said In^r Rease his heirs and assigns agst him the said In^r Morgan jun^r & his heirs and against all and every other persons or persons whatsoever shall and will warrant and defend by these presents In Witness whereof the said In^r Morgan jun^r hath hereunto set his hand & affixed his seal the day and year first above written
