This Indenture made this thirteenth day of January one thousand seven hundred and sixty three Between Thomas Fisher and Mary his wife of Mansfield City in Virginia of the one part and John Blythe of Southampton County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Tho. Fisher and Mary his wife for and in consideration of the sum of twenty five pounds current money of Virginia by the said John Blythe in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt whereof the said Tho. Fisher and Mary his wife doth here by acknowledge acquit & discharge the said John Blythe his heirs execs and adms forever by these presents they the said Tho. Fisher & Mary his wife hath granted bargained sold aliened released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said John Blythe and his heirs and assigns forever a certain plantation tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the parish of Northway & County of Southampton whereon Timothy Drake lately lived containing by estimation two hundred acres or thereabouts more or less being part of a patent granted to Abithur Williams by the Honourable William Goodloe his Majesty's Lieut Governor and commander in chief of the colony and dominions of Virginia bearing date the tenth day of July one thousand seven hundred and sixty five by him transferred by deed of bargain sold unto the said Thomas Fisher bearing date the 9th day of June 1757 & bounded as followeth Beginning at a marble standing in a marsh in or near Tho. Bennys line from thence running up the various courses of the run of a swamp called the Cuppus swamp till it comes to In Barnes line from thence the said Barnes line till it comes to Timothy Drakes line from thence along Drakes line to a branch from thence down the various courses of the run of the said branch to the first station To have & to hold all and singular the said land and premises with the appurtenances thereto belonging unto the said John Blythe his heirs and assigns forever and the said Thomas Fisher & Mary his wife for themselves their heirs or assigns the said plantation tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances above mentioned and every part thereof & their heirs execs adms and assigns the said John Blythe his heirs execs adms or assigns shall and will warrant and forever defend by these presents In Witnes whereof the said Tho. Fisher and Mary his wife have hereunto set their hands and affixed their seals the day and year above written

This Indenture made this fifteenth day of February one thousand seven hundred and sixty three Between Arthur Arrington of Edgecomb County in North Carolina of the one part and Henry Adams of Southampton City of the other part Witnesseth that the said Arthur Arrington for and in consideration of twenty pounds current money of Virginia the said Henry Adams in hand paid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents the receipt of which and himself fully satisfied contented and paid and doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained and sold aliened and confirmed and by these presents doth give grant bargain sell alien and confirm to the said Henry Adams his heirs and assigns forever part of a tract of land containing eighty acres more or less conveyed from the chief of the Northway Indians

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
