and Watson Gray of said county of the other part Witnesseth that the said
Cordall Norfleet for and in consideration of the sum of sixty five pounds current
money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Watson Gray at and before the
making and delivery hereof the receipt whereof the said Cordall Norfleet doth hereby
acknowledge and thereof doth acquit the said Watson Gray his heirs executors
He doth granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed confirmed and made over and by
these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff confirm and make over unto
the said Watson Gray his heirs and assigns forever the two following tracts parcel
situated of land to wit the one being the plantation wherein Edward Windham
formerly lived containing by estimation forty acres of land more or less bounded
as followeth Beginning at a pine on the south side of the flat swamp at
corner of John Morgans land thence by Morgans line south forty degrees west
ninety four poles to a red oak then south forty degrees east to a hickory a corner
