 thing herein contained shall cease determine and be void any thing herein contained
 to the contrary notwithstanding and the said Thomas Gray for himself his heirs and
 assigns doth covenant grant to and with the said Gray Briggs his heirs and
 assigns forever that he the said Thomas will pay and satisfy to the said Gray the
 aforesaid sum of five hundred and seventy five pounds without any deduction
 whatsoever together with lawful interest thereon to arise from the day of the date

 sum of five hundred and fifty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand
 paid by the said Thomas Williamson at or before the inscaling and delivery of these
 presents the receipt whereof the said Hinchey Taylor doth hereby acknowledge and they
 acquit and discharge the said Thomas Williamson his heirs and assigns by these
 presents that he granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed released and confirmed and
 by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff release and confirm unto the
 said Thomas Williamson and his heirs and assigns forever all ^{that} plantation tract situate
 of land situate lying and being in the aforesaid parish of Nottonay County of South
 ampton on the south side of the lightwood swamp and also a watergras mill together
 with 10 acres of land adjoining the same on the north side of the said swamp

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
