This Indenture made this eleventh day of August one thousand seven hundred and sixty three in the third year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King George the third Between David Edmunds of Southampton county in the Colony of Virginia of the one part and Thomas Francis of the county aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that the said David Edmunds for and in consideration of the sum of thirty pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Thomas Francis the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof doth acquit the said Thomas Francis his heirs executors He hath granted bargained sold alien released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release confirm unto the said Thomas Francis his heirs assigns forever part of a tract of land containing by estimation one hundred and thirty seven acres and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a white Oak standing in John Goggins line thence south twelve degrees east along Richard Aways line to a small branch then up the run of the said branch to a small piece a corner tree of a dividing line between the said Edmunds and James Turner thence along the said dividing line a south course to Benjamin Clements line thence along the said Clements line north sixty degrees west one hundred and fifty pole to a black oak another corner of the said Clements land thence south forty four degrees west forty seven pole to a turkey oak standing in Benjamin Westbrookes line thence north seventy six degrees west

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
