

it should and might be lawful for the chief men of the said nation together with the said Joseph Gray Howell Edmunds and William Taylor their trustees to execute any deed or deeds intended for the conveyance of the fee simple and inheritance of the said lands to the purchasers who should give bonds and security for the payment of the purchase money to the said trustees and any deed or deeds so executed perfected and acknowledged or proved and recorded according to the directions of the said act should be sufficient to pass the fee simple estate of the said land as sold to the purchaser as by the said in part recited act of assembly more fully is contained Now this Indenture Witnesseth that the said Will^m March Robin Scholar and Thomas Turner chief men of the nottaway indian nation and the said Joseph Gray Howell Edmunds and William Taylor for and in consideration of the sum of thirty four pounds current money to the said Joseph Gray Howell Edmunds and William Taylor in hand paid by the said Henry Taylor at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents for the use of the said nottaway indian nation the receipt whereof they do hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Henry Taylor his heirs executors and assigns they the said Will^m March Robin Scholar and Thomas Turner chief men of the nottaway indian nation and the said Joseph Gray Howell Edmunds and William Taylor have granted bargained and sold aliened released and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said Henry Taylor and his heirs and assigns forever two hundred eighty and seven acres of land lying and being in the parish of nottaway and county aforesaid and denoted in the surveyors plot of the indian land by number 1 and bounded as follows Beginning at a small pine a corner of N^o 16. on Beech horn road thence up the various courses of the said road to a black oak a corner of N^o 3 thence S W 250 P^o to a small black oak thence S 2 1/2 deg E 170 pole to a small pine in J^r Thomas's line thence along his line to the beginning together with all woods underwoods trees waits waters water courses long grounds profits commodities hereditaments appurtenances whatsoever to the said two hundred eighty and seven acres of land belonging in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder and remainders unto issues and profits thereof and all the estate right title and interest of the said nottaway indians of in or to the same or any part thereof To have to hold the said two hundred eighty and seven acres of land and premises with the appurtenances unto the said Henry Taylor his heirs and assigns To the only proper use and behoof of the said Henry Taylor his heirs and assigns forever In Witness whereof the parties to these presents have hereunto set their hands and seals
