This Indenture made this 7 day of December in the third year of the reign of our sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of gods of Great Britain France and Ireland King (defender of the faith &c. And in the year of our Lords Christ one thousand seven hundred and fifty three Between Joseph Poles of the parish of Mottonway in the County of Southampton of the one part and Blythe Williams of the same parish and County of the other part Witnesseth that the said Joseph Poles for in consideration of the sum of five pounds current money of Virginia to him in hand paid by the said Blythe Williams the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge and thereof acquit and discharge the said Blythe Williams that he granted bargained and sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Blythe Williams and to his heirs & assigns forever all that tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the County of Southampton containing by estimation ninety acres be the same more or less and bounded as followeth Beginning at a corner tree a white oak thence along Stephenson's line to a corner tree a corner tree a red oak thence along Mannings line to the Village Branch thence down the said branch to a pine alone tree thence along the said Mannings line to the first station the same being part of a tract or parcel of land which Joseph Poles purchased being thereto his own freehold and at large appears And all houses outhouses edifices buildings yards gardens orchards woods underwoods trees ways waters water courses profits emements hereditaments and appurtenances thereto belonging or in anywise appertaining and the reversion and reversions remainder surmounts rents issues and profits thereof and of every part parcel thereof and the estate right title interest property claim and demand whatsoever of
