This Indenture made the ninth of January one thousand seven hundred and sixty four in the seventh year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King George the third Between James Westbrooke of South Hampton county in the Colony of Virginia of the one part and John Shope of the county aforesaid of the other part Witnesseth that said James Westbrooke for and in consideration of the sum of forty three pounds current money of Virginia to them in hand paid by the said John Shope at and before the ensailing delivery hereof the receipt whereof the said James Westbrooke doth hereby acknowledge and thereof doth acquit the said John Shope his heirs execs and assigns hath granted bargained sold aliened released and confirmed and by these presents doth grant bargain sell alien release and confirm unto the said John Shope his heirs and assigns forever one certain tract parcel or divided lot of land situated lying and being in the county aforesaid containing by estimation two hundred acres of land more or less and bounded as followeth to wit Beginning at a Maple on a small branch a corner tree of Edward Matthews land then up the school house branch to a turkey oak in the head thereof then north forty two degrees east eighty eight pole to a pine a corner of William Johns land then along his line south thirty seven degrees east one hundred & fifty pole to a red oak by the said Johnsons fence thence south thirty degrees east one hundred and twenty pole to a pine thence north fifty five degrees east sixty two pole to a pine on George branch and up the branch to a small gum
