This indenture made this third day of May in the fifth year of the reign of our sovereign Lord King George the third anno domini one thousand seven hundred and sixty five Between Samuel Sauls of Southampton county in colo of Virginia of the one part and Horrell Edwards of the county and colo aforesd of the other part Wt. respectt that as well for and in consideration of the sum of forty pounds current money of Virginia by him the said Horrell Edwards to him the said Samuel Sauls in hand paid the receipt whereof he doth hereby acknowledge hath granted bargained sold aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents do grant bargain sell alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Horrell Edwards his heirs and assigns forever two certain tracts or parcels of land one bounded by the other containing by estimation twenty one acres be the same more or less situated lying and being in Southampton county aforesaid to wit Beginning at the mouth of a small branch on the flat swamp near the beaver ponds that divides the said lands from William Vaughans lands and running up the said branch north near to the head thence by a straight line of marked trees to the old line so up the said line to the corner from thence along William Bowers line to the marsh so down the marsh to the beginning the above bounded contains seventy five acres and is the upper part of a tract of two hundred and eighty acres taken up and patented by May Jackson also one other tract or parcel of land containing sixteen acres joining the above said tract and granted to Benjamin Clemens by patent bearing date the twenty fifth day of September one thousand seven hundred and sixty two in the second year of his majesty's reign Beginning at above a corner of the above said land in the head of a small branch thence down the same to a corner of William Bowers land thence that branch to the flat swamp then up the same to a corner of William Bowers land thence by his line north seven degrees eighty two poles to a pine standing in the other old line aforesd and by the same south twelve degrees east twenty poles to the beginning with all and singular the rites and appurtenances together with all manner
