This Indenture made this eleventh day of July in the year of our lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty three Between Peter Butts Thomas Williamson Abridgton James Richard Hello Benjamin Clemerts Benjamin Clemerts jr^r Daniel Fisher John Boykin Charles Simmonds Charles Briggs and Moses Cary now chosen vestry men of nottoway parish of Southampton county of the one part Witneseth that the said vestrymen aforesd agreeable to an act of an act of assembl made in the year of our lord one thousand seven hundred and sixty two for and in consideration of the sum of sixty two pounds ten shillings current money of virginia to us in hand paid by Richard Ricks the receipt whereof the said Vestrymen doth hereby acknowledge we the said vestrymen hath granted bargained and sold alien and conveyed and by these presents doth grant bargain and sell alien and convey unto the said Richard Ricks his heirs and assigns forever one certain seat tract or parcel of land situate lying and being in the parish of nottoway and county of Southampton aforesd containing by estimation two hundred acres formerly being the glebe of the said parish be the same more or less it being part of twelve hundred and forty acres of land granted to Richard Washington as appears by patent bearing date the sixteenth day of December one thousand seven hundred and fourteen the said two hundred acres of land being bounded as followeth Begin-
 ning on the west side of the Trough branch where the patent line crosses the said branch thence along the patent line to a white oak then north eight degrees west one hundred and twenty six pole to a black oak then north forty two degrees west eighty four pole to a white oak then north twenty six degrees west thirty seven pole to a pine then north ten degrees east thirty seven pole to a black oak then north fourteen degrees west ninety eight pole to a pine then south sixty nine degrees west seventy one poles to a pine by the edge of a meadow then south five degrees east two hundred
