This indenture made this twenty seventh day of May in the year of our Lord
god one thousand seven hundred and sixty five and in the fifth year of the reign
of our sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of god of Great Britain France and
Ireland King defender of the faith for Mary Myrick of the county of Southampton
and parish of Saint Luke being widow and relict of Owen Myrick deceased Mitropette
that for and in consideration of the sum of five shillings current money of Virginia
to me in hand paid by my son in law Henry Applewhite of the parish of county
aforesaid at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents but more especially for
and in consideration of the natural love and affection which I have & bear unto
my said son in law and for the advancement in the world of the said Henry
Applewhite I have given granted aliened enfeoffed and confirmed and by these presents
doth give grant bargain alien enfeoff and confirm unto the said Henry Applewhite
his heirs and assigns forever three negroes viz a wench called Senior a boy called Will
and a girl called Rachel To have & to hold the said negroes to the only proper use and
behalf of him the said Henry Applewhite his heirs and assigns forever and the said
Mary Myrick for herself her heirs executors and assigns doth covenant promise & agree
to and with the said Henry Applewhite his heirs and assigns by these presents
that the said Henry Applewhite hath good right full power and lawful
authority to grant sell or convey the aforesaid negroes and that the said negroes
is free and clear from all other gifts grants titles wills entails judgments
executions and extents and from all other incumbrances whatsoever whatsoever
the same not only agt myself my heirs executors & assigns but against all and
every other person and persons whatsoever that shall or may claim any right
thereunto will warrant and forever defend by these presents in Witness
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and affixed my seal the day and year
