sovereign Lord George the Third by the grace of God of Great Britain France of Ireland King of
the faith, &c and in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred of sixty five
Between Edward Lundy son of the parish of Saint Luke and county of Southampton of the
one part and Byrd Lundy of the same parish and county son of the said Edward of the other
part Witnesseth that for and in consideration of the natural love and affection which the
said Edward hath for and beareth towards the said Byrd he the said Edward hath
granted given aliened and confirmed by these presents doth give grant alien and confirm
unto the said Byrd Lundy his heirs and assigns forever two negroes vizt a negro boy called
Stafford and a negro girl called Arney with all their increase to him and his heirs
forever to have & to hold the said two negroes and their increase to him the said
Byrd Lundy his heirs and assigns forever to the only proper use and behoof of the said
Byrd Lundy his heirs and assigns forever and for no other use intent or purpose whatsoever
in witness whereof the said Edward Lundy hath hereunto set his hand and affixed his seal the
