This Indenture made this seventeenth day of Sept<sup>r</sup> in the sixth year of the reign of our  
Sovereign Lord George the third by the grace of God of Great Britain France & Ireland King  
defender of the faith &c in the year of our lord God one thousand seven hundred & sixty six  
between John Hines of the county of Southampton & parish of Netton of the one part & William  
Hines of the afores<sup>d</sup> county & parish of the other part Witnesseth that for & in consideration  
of the sum of fifty pounds current money of Virginia to the P<sup>r</sup> John Hines in hand paid  
by the P<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Hines at or before the enrolling & delivery of the receipt whereof the P<sup>r</sup> John Hines  
doth hereby acknowledge & thereof & therefrom doth release acquit & discharge the  
P<sup>r</sup> W<sup>m</sup> Hines his heirs & assigns forever by these presents be the P<sup>r</sup> John Hines
