will & affection which I have to & bear towards my loving son in law Moses Joyner of South
ampton county in Virginia planter, have given & granted & by these presents do freely
clearly & absolutely give & grant to the said Moses Joyner his heirs & assigns & to the following
slaves to wit. one wench named Pat one negroe boy named Jacob, one negroe girl named
Tennis & one negroe girl named Kate To have & to hold all the said slaves unto the said Moses
Joyner his heirs & assigns & assigns from henceforth as of their proper goods forever
absolutely without any manner of condition as I the said Joseph Tich have absolutely & of my
own accord & vol & put in further testimony In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
& seal this twentieth day of Oct. in the year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & sixty six

This Indenture made this 9 day of December in the sixth year of the reign of our sovereign Lord
George the third by the grace of God of Great Britain France & Ireland King Defender of the Faith &c
in the year of our Lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & sixty six Between Simon Johnson
of the county of Southampton of the one part & Joshua Turner of the same county of the other part
Witnesseth that the said Simon Johnson for & in consideration of the sum of four pounds & current
money to him in hand paid by the said Joshua Turner the receipt whereof the said Simon Johnson
doth hereby acknowledge & her receipt & discharge the said Joshua Turner his heirs & assigns
& assigns hath granted bargain'd & sold & by these presents doth grant bargain & sell unto
the said Joshua Turner & to his heirs & assigns forever one hundred & eighty acres of land contain
ing by estimation to the same more or less lying & being in the parish of St. Mary & county
of Southampton & bounded as followeth Beginning at a fence by a line in James Cornish
line & from thence a line of marked trees to a white oak in Arthur Turner line & from
thence a line of marked trees to a pine joining to Rich. Woods land then by the Woods
line to a scrubby white oak the first station reference being thereto had may more
fully & at large appear & all houses out houses edifices buildings yards gardens
orchards trees ways waters water courses profits & commodities thereto appertaining
& appurtenances to the said tract or parcel of land belonging or in any wise apper
taining & the reversion & reversions remainder & remainders with issues & profits there
of & every part & parcel thereof & also all the estate right title property claim & de
mand of whatsoever of him the said Simon Johnson or to the same or any part
thereof To have & to hold the said tract or parcel of land with the appurtenances unto
the said Joshua Turner his heirs & assigns for ever to the only proper use & behoof of him
the said Joshua Turner his heirs & assigns & the said Simon Johnson for himself & his
heirs & assigns doth covenant grant & agree to & with the said Joshua Turn
his heirs & assigns for ever that the said Simon Johnson the above mentioned tract
or parcel of land & premises with the appurtenances unto the said Joshua Turn
his heirs & assigns & against the claim & demand of him the said Simon Johnson his
heirs & assigns & against the claim & demand of all & every person or persons
whatsoever shall & will warrant & forever defend by these presents In witness
whereof the said Simon Johnson & Elizabeth Johnson wife of the said Simon
Johnson both hereunto set their hands & seals the day & year first above written
