This Indenture made this 21 day of Feb^y in the seventh year of the reign
 of our sovereign lord George the third now king of Great Britain &c. in the year of
 our lord Christ one thousand seven hundred & sixty seven Between Abraham Joynes
 of the province of North Carolina & county of Southampton of the Parish of Nottoway
 in the county of Southampton of the other part witnesseth that the
 Abraham Joynes for & in consideration of the sum of five shillings &c. money of
 Virginia to him in hand paid by the ^{W^m} Thomas Hencock the receipt whereof the
 Abraham Joynes doth hereby acknowledge & thereof acquit & discharge the
 Thomas Hencock his heirs & executors & administrators by these presents both
 granted bargain sold alien & confirm & confirmed by these presents doth grant
 bargain sell alien & confirm unto the ^{W^m} Thomas Hencock to his heirs &
 assigns for ever all that tract or parcel of land situate lying & being in the
 parish of Nottoway & county of Southampton containing by estimation one
 hundred & forty acres be the same more or less bounded as followeth to wit begin-
 ning at a pine on the south side of Blackwater standing on a branch down
 the said branch to a corner pine standing on the cattle branch
 from thence a long a line of Giles Smelly's to a live oak then a long
 a line of John Lawrences to a red oak then a line W^m Joynes
 to a black oak a corner tree so a long a line to a black oak a corner tree
 from thence to the beginning together with all houses outhouses edifices
 buildings yards gardens orchards trees ways water water courses profits
 commodities hereditaments & appurtenances to the said Plantation
