Fitch at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt hereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Gurley does by these presents grant, bargain and sell unto the said Robert J. Fitch, one certain piece or parcel of land supposed to contain five acres or thereabouts more or less it being a part of the Wendall tract lying in front of the house of the said Fitch, line to commence at a new four y aff persimmon tree west of said Fitch's residence, thence a straight line north east to intersection with Mrs Charlotte Bryant's land near the present corner. To Have & to Hold the said piece or parcel of land to him his heirs or assigns forever free from the claim of the said Gurley or any person claiming by, through or under him.
