This Deed made this the 18th of February in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty one, between George Johnson of the one part and Jesse B. Dick of the other part, both of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witnesseth that the said Johnson of the first part doth grant unto Jesse B. Dick trustee, of the other part, the following property to wit: the tract of land on which said Johnson now resides containing one hundred and sixteen acres more or less, household and kitchen furniture, crops of all kinds, one horse, one mule, cattle and stock of all kinds, farming utensils. In trust to secure the following debts, one bond due Wm. H. Prettow for seventy five dollars with interest from Feby 18th 1861, one bond due Thomas J. Prettow for thirty or forty dollars, the exact amount not known, and one bond due W. Prettow for seven dollars, one bond due Nathan Johnson for sixty dollars, one bond due Madison J. Davis for fifty ten dollars, and it is agreed that should the said Johnson in a reasonable time neglect to pay said debts that the said trustee when requested by any creditor under deed shall after giving ten days notice proceed to sell property hereby conveyed and first pay all debts secured under this deed, and the balance if any pay over to said Johnson.

This Deed made this the 23rd day of January in the year eighteen hundred and sixty one, between John D. Applwhite of the County of Southampton of the one part and W. W. Briggs as trustee of the other part. Witnesseth that the said John D. Applwhite doth grant, convey, transfer, assign and set over unto the said W. W. Briggs the following property to wit: All the household and kitchen furniture now in his possession (and not exempt by law from the operation of this deed) also one double gun, one gold watch, all his agricultural implements, one cotton gin, two horses, one head of cattle of all his crops with the increase thereof, also all the crop of every name, kind and description which shall be made on his plantation during the present year and whether now growing or to be hereafter grown especially grain, cotton, fruit, brandy, &c. which are to be sent to Petersburg and sold by R. F. Leslie, and the net proceeds to be applied as a credit on the note hereinafter mentioned. In trust to secure R. F. Leslie the sum of five hundred and fifty dollars growing due by a negotiable note for that amount bearing date the 25th day of December A.D. 1860 and payable twelve months from and after the date thereof, subject however to certain accretions specified in a receipt executed by said Leslie to said Applwhite and dated this
