This deed made this thirteenth day of June in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty one, between Jno. J. Winfree Commissioner of the first part and Amos S. Pope of the other part, Witnesseth, that whereas the said Winfree by a decree of the Circuit Court of Southampton County rendered at the May term then of A. D. 1858, was appointed a special Commissioner to sell the real estate in the proceedings mentioned (the style of which said is Amos S. Pope vs. Claude) of which said real estate Nathan Pope died seized and which is supposed to contain four hundred and sixty acres more or less and is bounded by the lands of Richard Darden Jacob Wilkines, George S. Pope and Giles Pope and whereas the said Amos S. Pope became the purchaser of the said real estate for the sum of fifteen hundred dollars and has paid to the said Winfree the sum of seven hundred and eight dollars and seventy five cents with legal interest thereon to this day. Now this deed Witnesseth that the said Winfree by virtue of a subsequent decree of the said Court rendered at the May term then of A. D. 1859 doth hereby grant and convey to the said Pope all such right, title and interest in and to all and every of the tract of land with all its appurtenances that may be vested in him as such Commissioner with special warranty.

This Deed made this 18th day of May 1861, between Wm. A. Hasdorn Commissioner appointed under a decree of the Circuit Court of Sussex County to sell the land of which Isaac J.
