This Indenture made this 23rd day of May 1861, between William Prince & Ann, his wife, of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia of the first part and Samuel Drury of said County & State of the other part, Witnesseth that for full Consideration of the sum of Four hundred & seventy seven dollars, the Receipt thereof is fully acknowledged the said Prince have bargained and sold unto the said Drury a certain tract of Land bounded as follows by the Lands of said Drury's land, said Prince and William Greppard on the west by said Drury Land on the South and South east by the Poplar Swamp on the north, beginning in the old mill run between the road & Mill pond at a corner for the said Samuel Drury, thence along his line S. 15 1/2° East 3 1/2 poles to a pine thence S. 26° E. 4 1/2 poles to a pine S. 8 1/2° E. 19 poles to a pine thence S. 10° E. 7 poles to a black gum thence S. 31° W. 15 1/4 poles to a Black Gum thence N. 53° W. 63 poles to a Sweet Gum at the road & Mill pond, a corner for the said Saml. Drury, thence up the Margin of the Mill Pond 14 poles to a papaw gum at a new corner, between the parties, thence along a new line S. 15° W. 7 1/2 poles to a pine at the road, thence South 69° E. 33 1/2 poles to an old mulberry tree, thence S. 38° E. 12 poles to a Post, thence S. 1° W. 12 poles to a post, thence S. 31 1/2° W. 66 poles to two post oak, a new corner for the parties in William Greppard line, thence along his line S. 42° E. 15 1/2 poles to a dead Sweet gum, thence South 38° E. 12 poles to a dead oak, thence S. 33 1/2° E. 7 poles to a maple, thence S. 45 1/2° E. 11 poles to a red oak, thence S. 41° E. 13 1/2 poles to a Sweet gum, thence S. 19 1/2° E. 9 poles to a pine, thence S. 12 1/2° E. 8 1/4 poles to a white oak a corner for said Drury.
