

This Deed made this 2<sup>d</sup> day of May 1862 between Demasus L Dole of the 1<sup>st</sup> part and William W Branch of the 2<sup>d</sup> County of the other part. witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars the said Demasus L Dole doth grant & warrant unto the said William W Branch a certain tract of land known as the Jamesville tract of land containing by estimation 353 acres, and bounded by the lands of Isham P Boykin & Patrick Dole and the sea creek swamp. This Indenture made this 1<sup>st</sup> day of November 1861 between James Drury of the 1<sup>st</sup> part and Benjamin Turner of the second part both parties of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia. witnesseth, that the said James Drury for the consideration of Four hundred ninety five and  $\frac{7}{10}$  hundred dollars, have sold unto the said Benjamin Turner a certain piece of land containing Two hundred and seventy two and one third acres, to be the same more or less, the land is bounded on the east & south by the lands of Francis T Ridley, on the West by said James Drury, on the North by said Drury & Ridley to be more explicit, the said land is known as part of the Whitchurch tract with all its former boundaries except on the West end, which line may be described as follows. Beginning at a black gum in a branch near the causeway, a new corner in Francis T Ridleys line, thence along a new line of marked trees at 20° E 47 1/4 poles to a mulberry tree, thence at 32° E 29 1/4 poles to a corner near a point in said James Drury's line, which land with all improvements thereon the said James Drury do warrant the title of the same to the said Benjamin Turner and his heirs - In testimony whereof the said James Drury do hereby set his hand and seal this day and year above written acknowledged before

Atchley and his wife do grant unto the said Samuel B. Trotter a certain parcel or lot of land containing Seven eighths of an acre more or less, at Franklin Southampton County Virginia, bounded as follows: beginning at the Jerusalem road and the corner of A. W. Atchley's warehouse lot running at right angles with the Jerusalem road within one foot of A. W. Atchley's warehouse down to R.
