In pursuance to a decree of Record in the Clerks Office of Southampton County said Richard W. Clayton Commissioner allotted to Mary A. Clayton one half and having duly advertised the remaining one half proceeded to sell it at public auction and Mary A. Clayton became the purchaser for the sum of One hundred and nineteen dollars and 7/100. Now I Richard W. Clayton as Commissioner do grant unto Mary A. Clayton all my right, title and interest in the above mentioned land containing fifty two acres & the same more or less lying in the County of Southampton State of Virginia and bounded as follows on the North and South by the lands of Mary A.
