appointed by the County Court of Southampton, State of Virginia at the March Term 1860 to divide one hundred  
and four acres of land and all one half of said land to Mary A. Clayton and sell the other half for the benefit of  
Isaac, Glasgow five children & wife Mary A. C. Glasgow, Lydia A. Glasgow, William H. Glasgow, Isaac  
Glasgow and James C. Glasgow. In pursuance to a decree of Record in the Clerks Office of Southampton Co  
said Richard W. Clayton Commissioner allotted to Mary A. Clayton one half and having duly advertised the  
remaining one half proceeded to sell it at public auction and Mary A. Clayton became the purchaser for the sum  
of One hundred and nineteen dollars and 75/100. Now I Richard W. Clayton as Commissioner do grant unto  
Mary A. Clayton all my right, title and interest in the above mentioned land containing fifty two acres or the same  
more or less lying in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia and bounded as follows. On the East and  
South by the lands of Mary A. Clayton on the East by Sea-cook Swamp and on the West by the land of
