This Deed made this 16th day of May 1862 between Jno. M. Gurley of the first part and James Wells of the second part, both of the County of Southampton & State of Virginia Witnesses, that for and in consideration of the sum of fifty dollars in hand paid by the said Wells at and before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, the said Jno. M. Gurley doth by these presents sell and convey to the said James Wells his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or moiety of land bounded as follows to wit: commencing on the South west side of a Moray river at a Cypress near the margin of S. river, thence a straight line across said river to a small Stringwood on the South east side of said river in Wm S. Hedges land, thence a South east down said Hedges line to a small Sycamore near the margin of said river, thence a straight line across said river a South West course to a Cypress standing in a cove thence North to the beginning; supposed to contain about one acre, be the same more or less. To have and to hold the said tract or lot of land above described free from the claim of the said Jno. M. Gurley and all persons claiming by, through or under him. Given under my hand & Seal the day and date above written.
