 the said Martha Cobb for and in consideration of the sum of thirty six dollars to her in hand paid
 by the said Robert Williams at or before the sealing and delivery of these presents, the receipt
 whereof is hereby acknowledged, hath granted, bargained and sold and by these presents doth grant,
 bargain and sell unto him the said Robert Williams his heirs and assigns forever, one certain tract or
 parcel of land situated lying and being in the aforesaid County of Southampton and Parish of
 Saint Lukes, containing by estimation twelve acres be the same more or less, lying on the south side
 of bean creek and bounded by the lands of Benjamin Bryant, the heirs of Elbe Whitley &c and
 Robert Williams. To have and to hold the above described tract or parcel of land and premises
 with the appurtenances whatsoever belonging or in any wise appertaining unto him the said Robert Williams
 his heirs and assigns forever, to and for the only proper use and behoof of him the said Robert Williams
 his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Martha Cobb for herself, her heirs, Executors and administrators
 doth hereby covenant and agree to and with the said Robert Williams his heirs, Executors, administrators
 and assigns that she will by these warrants and forever defend all the right and title of the aforesaid
 tract or parcel of land and premises with its appurtenances thereto belonging, against the claims or
 demands of all and every other person or persons whatsoever. On Witness whereof the said Martha

This Deed made this 16th day of October in the year 1862 between L.R. Edwards and Wm.
 Atkinson of the one part and Eliza Lewis of the other part. Witnesseth that whereas the said Eliza Lewis
 & Ann her wife by deed admitted to record on the 11th day of May 1861 did convey to the said L.R. Edwards
 a certain tract or parcel of land lying in Southampton County containing two hundred and eighty one and one
 half acres more or less and more particularly described in said deed, On Trust to secure William
 Atkinson as his the said Eliza Lewis' security to a bond due Alfred T. Stephenson for eight hundred
 and fifty nine ⁵⁹100 Dollars. And whereas since the execution of the deed aforesaid the said Eliza Lewis
 has paid off and discharged the bond aforesaid thereby releasing the said Atkinson as his security.
 Therefore the said L.R. Edwards in consideration of the premises and with the consent of the said William
 Atkinson signified by his signing these presents, doth hereby release and convey unto the said
 Eliza Lewis the tract of land herein before mentioned and described with special warranty.
