R. Road Co. and adjoining the lands of Lewis Veach east and west, the heirs of Josiah Worrell on the South and I Hundred on the North. The above named tract or parcel of land belonged to John Story on which he died, and on which Melly Worrell now resides. For the above named consideration of Ten dollars, I hereby grant and convey to the said Wm W Beaton his heirs and assigns my entire interest in said tract or parcel of land.
