

This deed made under the 8th day of November 1862 between Exum L Crumpler Commissioner, of the first part and James T Borden of the second part, Witnespeth, that in consideration of the sum of Seven hundred and ninety six dollars to him in hand paid by the said James T Borden the said Exum L Crumpler doth grant unto the said James T Borden all that tract of land lying on Black Water formerly belonging to Benjamin Crumpler deceased containing by estimation fifty 50 acres bounded by the lands of Joseph A. Johnson his heirs & executors, Mr. Duck and Arthur Johnson. The said Exum L Crumpler covenants that he will warrant generally the property hereby conveyed. Witness the following signatures and seal.

This deed made on this fourteenth day of November in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty two between Thomas H Urquhart party of the first part and Francis E Williams party of the second part, all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia, Witnespeth that in consideration of the sum of Eight hundred dollars paid to the party of the first part, the receipt of which he hereby acknowledges, he the said Thomas H Urquhart does give, grant, bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Francis E Williams and his heirs forever with general warranty the tract of land in the County and State above named known as the Dick Hines tract containing three hundred and twenty acres more or less, for boundaries see deed from I & J James to T H Urquhart. The said T H Urquhart covenants that he has the right to convey the said land to the grantee, that he has done no act to encumber the said land, that the grantee shall have quiet possession of the said land free from all encumbrances, and that he the said party of the first part, will execute such further assurances of the said land as may be required. This Indenture made & entered into this 15th day of November 1862 between Richard Williams & his wife Winifred Williams of the one part and Augustus W Williams of the other part, Witnespeth, that the said Richard Williams & wife for & in consideration of the sum of one dollar to him in hand paid by the said Augustus W Williams, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has granted, bargained, sold & delivered, by these presents do grant, bargain, sell and deliver unto the said Augustus W Williams his heirs & assigns a certain tract or parcel of land lying & being in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, & bounded as follows. Beginning at the East side of a road running near the said Richard Williams, thence up Roundhill branch to Urquhart's line, on the West to a mill pond, thence down Pond's line to the Road, & containing by late survey, two hundred and twelve acres, more or less, together with all and singular the privileges & appurtenances whatsoever
