 missioner) of the first part and James G. Jones of the second part, Witnessest, that in consideration of the sum - five hundred and twenty five dollars to him in hand by the said James G. Jones, the  
 said E. L. Crumpler doth grant unto the said James G. Jones all that tract of land formerly  
 owned by Benj<sup>a</sup> Crumpler (which is set apart for the house of Amy Crumpler widow of said  
 Benjamin Crumpler containing by estimation one hundred acres more or less and bounded by the  
 lands of Mr. T. Horriss, James G. Jones, and the lands belonging to the heirs of Robert Hart. The  
 said E. L. Crumpler covenants that he will warrant generally the property hereby conveyed.

This deed made this 2<sup>nd</sup> day of March 1863 between Mills B. Barrott of the City of  
 Petersburg of the first part and A. L. Summerville of the County of Southampton of the other  
 part, Witnessest, that whereas a marriage is intended shortly to be had and solemnized between  
 the said parties, and the said A. L. Summerville is possessed of certain estate real and personal  
 which the said Mills B. Barrott is desirous should be settled upon the said A. L. Summerville  
 for her own separate use and benefit, it is therefore agreed by the said Barrott that he shall have no  
 portion or interest whatever in any estate of any kind of which the said Summerville may be seized or  
 possessed. But it is agreed and bargained by and between the said parties that notwithstanding  
 any thing herein contained the said Summerville shall and does retain the power and privilege to  
 dispose of any property and all the property of every kind of which she may be possessed, by her  
 last Will and testament as if she were a single person to any person whomsoever without any exception  
 intended by this agreement. Witness our hands and seals, the day and year first above written.
