Hart shall take good care of the said Charles Hart in sickness and in health finding a house and home for him during the remainder of his natural life. he the said Charles Hart having to find his own food, clothing, in consideration of this above condition the said Charles Hart doth convey and make over to the said E. M. Hart all his right and title in a certain tract of land lying in Southampton County known as the home tract on which he the said Charles Hart has lived for many years. the said tract containing by estimation One hundred and ten acres more or less and bounded by the lands of Capt. B. L. Dow, Liggio Fournel and Jacob D. Swamps. The condition of this deed will commence from this date and the fee simple right to the land both hereby become vested in the said E. M. Hart though he cannot have a title
