This deed made this the 6th day of April 1863 between Matthew W. Vaughan of the one part and Allen H. Cotton and Elmira his wife of the other part all of the County of Southampton and State of Virginia Witnesses, that in consideration of the sum of three hundred and ninety three ⁷⁶/₁₀₀ Dollars (\$393.76) the said Allen H. Cotton and Elmira his wife have sold to the said M. W. Vaughan (the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged) all their right, title and interest in a certain tract or portion of land lying in the aforesaid County of Southampton (it being a part of the tract of land known as the Anthony Vaughan tract which tract of land the said Allen H. Cotton purchased of Albert W. Cobb containing seventy six (76) acres 3 R and 25 P. more or less and bounded as follows. Commencing at a hickory on the road leading from Jerusalem to Smiths Ferry - a corner tree for said M. W. Vaughan and Allen H. Cotton and on the line of Orum Vaughan's tract thence to a black gum a corner tree for said M. W. Vaughan and Allen H. Cotton and on the line of Bryant Holland thence to a Post oak on a ridge in M. W. Vaughan's line, thence to a red oak near the road - thence to the hickory the place of commencement with general warranters.
