Conditioned that in consideration of the sum of One hundred and fifty dollars in hand paid by the said Ureah Bracy, the said Richard Barrett and Mary R his wife doth grant unto the said Ureah Bracy the following property to wit. One lot of land lying in the aforesaid County and State and in and near the Village of Franklin Dept on the north east side of the County road leading from Franklin Depot to Black Water or Suffolk, commencing first within five and a half feet of a small red oak chop near the side of the said road running N 69° E Seventy yds thence S 19° E Seventy yds thence S 69° W Seventy yds thence N 19° W Seventy yds to the beginning, making one acre of land.
