This Deed made this twenty-fourth day of November in the year one thousand eight hundred  
and Sixty-three between Norfleet L. Pond of the County of Southampton, of the first part, and Thomas  
R. Pond of said County, of the other part, witnesseth; that the said Norfleet L. Pond for and in  
consideration of the natural love and affection which he bears towards the said Thomas R. Pond, his  
son; as well as in the further consideration of one dollar to the said Norfleet by the said Thomas paid  
the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, doth grant and convey to the said Thomas R. Pond,  
to him and his heirs forever, the following property, real and personal estate, to wit, the tract of  
land on which the said grantor now resides, containing Seven hundred acres, more or less, and bound-  
ed by the lands of George C. Waller, Francis T. Ridley, the lands belonging to the estates of Amos  
Harris deceased and John C. Briggs deceased together with all the tenements and privileges  
thereunto in any belonging; the following negro slaves, Caroline, Ann, Mary, Julia, Ann, Peter  
Susan together with all the future increase of the said negroes; four head of horses with their increase,  
seven heads of cattle with their increase; and three oxen; Seven (11) heads of sheep and their  
increase; thirty-two (32) head of hogs and their increase; all the crop of Corn now on hand,  
gathered or ungathered, Seventy barrels more or less; all the crop of Sud Cotton about two thousand  
pounds; all the crop of fodder five thousand pounds more or less; all the crop of Potatoes, Sweet  
and Irish; the crop of Peas about thirty bushels (30); all the farming utensils of every description,  
one Waggon, three carts and wheels, plows of all kinds; one Carriage and harness; one buggy and  
team together with all other farming implements and utensils now in possession of said grantor;  
household and kitchen furniture of every description, eight beds with all their furniture, tables, chairs,  
clocks, Crockery and glass ware of every kind, knives and forks with all other furniture, household  
and kitchen not specially mentioned, all pots, ovens, shovels & tongs with all the tin and iron  
and wood ware, as tools &c of every description; One Still and Worm, with all the Cider fixtures,  
barrels, casks &c of every kind; all tools and implements belonging to the blacksmiths and wood  
joiner's shop of every kind; all timber, iron, Steel, Paints and materials of every kind now on  
hand for either shop; all boards and accounts due to the said grantor. But the whole of the afore-  
said property, real, personal or mixed, is granted and conveyed to the said Thomas R. Pond sub-  
ject to the following condition, to wit, that the said Thomas provide and furnish to the said  
Norfleet L. Pond, the said grantor, and to Elizabeth Pond, wife of the grantor and mother of  
the said grantee, a fair and liberal support and maintenance, in as good comfort as may be in the  
said Thomas power, for and during the natural lives of the said Norfleet and Elizabeth.
