Smith and his wife Anna E. Smith in consideration of the sum of five thousand dollars of lawful money of this Commonwealth to them in hand paid by the said Davis Vick at or before the executing and delivery of these presents (the receipt of which is hereby acknowledged) have bargained and sold, and by these presents do, and each of them doth bargain and sell unto the said Davis Vick his heirs and assigns a certain piece or parcel of land, in the County of Southampton, State of Virginia, lying on the south side of Northway River near the Cypress bridge formerly the property of Henry Blair, deceased, bounded on the North by said river, the West by the land of Tho. Ridley, on the south by Stephen H. Bishop, on the East by Archer & Oswin Vicks lands To have and to hold the said lands and tenements, hereditaments, and all and singular other the premises herein before mentioned unto the said Davis Vick his heirs and assigns forever, for the only proper use & behoof of him the said Davis Vick his heirs and assigns forever. And the said Wm. H. Smith and his wife Anna E. Smith for themselves and their heirs with all and singular the premises and appurtenances before mentioned unto the said Davis Vick his heirs and assigns free from the claim or claims of them the said Wm. H. Smith and his wife Anna E. Smith or either of them, their or either of their heirs and of all and every person or persons whatsoever shall, will and do warrant and forever defend by these presents.
