Holliman arrived personally appeared before us in our County aforesaid and being examined by us privately and apart from her husband and having the deed aforesaid fully explained to her, she the said Octavia R. Holliman acknowledged the same to be her act & deed and declared that she had willingly signed, sealed and delivered the same and that she wished not to retract it. Given under our hands & seals this 23^d day of November 1864.

This Deed made this the 10th day of October in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty five, between George A. Holliman of the one part and Robert T. Morris of the other part, both of the County of Curry and State of Virginia, Witnesseth, that in consideration of the sum of One thousand dollars, the said George A. Holliman doth grant unto the said Robert T. Morris and to his heirs and assigns all his lands lying in the County of Southampton Virginia, which lands he derived from the estate of his father George A. Holliman, said lands described somewhat in the following manner - 1st the "Jack Holliman Tract" on which W^m B. Hall now resides, and in which Fanny E. Hall has a dower interest, most of said tract of land lying on the East side of Proctors road leading to Jerusalem V^c and bounded by the lands of James B. Vuguhart, Robert J. Bailey and Peter Holmes, said tract of land containing One hundred and fifty acres more or less. 2nd the "Gray Holliman tract" on which Mrs. Gwaltney now resides, said tract lying on the West side of Proctors road, and bounded respectively by the lands of B. C. Drew, Jno. Crumpler and Robt. J. Bailey said tract containing One hundred acres more or less. 3rd the "Washington Tract" intersected by the said Proctors Road and bounded by the lands of Henry D. Bailey, Lucy C. Preston, Robert Nelson, Billy Branch and Moss Warren, containing fifty acres more or less. 4th the "Womble tract" intersected by the Norfolk & Petersburg Rail Road and bounded by the lands of Jno. Crumpler, James B. Vuguhart and Nancy Taylor, containing thirty acres more or less, all of which lands herein described, the said George A. Holliman doth grant and convey unto the said Robert T. Morris, to have and to hold the same to him and his heirs forever. The said George A. Holliman covenants that the said Robert T. Morris shall have quiet possession of all said lands. And the said George A. Holliman further agrees that he will warrant generally the property hereby conveyed. Witness the following Signatures this day and year aforesaid.
