This deed made this 13th day of December 1865, between Benj. E. Worrell administrator of Joseph E. Gillette who was trustee to a deed of trust executed by Lucy A. Drury on or about the 1st of January 1858 conveying to the said Gillette a certain tract land in the County of Southampton, containing about 10 1/4 acres bounded by the lands of James D. Mafsbury, Joseph E. Gillette, Wm. Drury & in trust to secure one bond due John Picklow for the sum of \$255, with interest from December 1st 1858, the said Worrell now acting as trustee in the place of his intestate, of the first part and William A. Mafsbury of the second part, Witnesseth, that for and in consideration of the sum of three hundred and eighty dollars paid by the said Mafsbury to the said Worrell, he the said Worrell as trustee as aforesaid doth grant to the said Mafsbury all that tract of land mentioned in the aforesaid deed of trust known as the Druryville tract, containing about 10 1/4 acres and bounded as aforesaid. Witnesseth, that the said Claud for and in consideration of the sum of one thousand dollars to him in hand paid, the receipt whereof is hereby acknowledged, has sold to the said Cobb all the oak timber standing on the tract land known as the Holt land lying in the County of Southampton on the three creeks now owned by the said Claud, and that the said Claud is to allow the said Cobb free ingress and egress for the period of ten years to cut & remove the timber aforesaid together with such posts and other small timber as may be required by the said Cobb for building stables & bridges necessary about the business aforesaid.
