This deed made this 25<sup>th</sup> day of February 1866 between Thomas J. Burbage of the first part, John W. Halstead Trustee of the second part and Annie O' Burbage, wife of the said T. J. Burbage of the third part. Whereas Thomas J. Burbage has received the sum of \$5,400 by his wife it being her estate which she has inherited from her father and brother. And whereas the said Burbage is anxious and willing to settle ~~temporarily~~ on the said Annie O' Burbage his wife other property of equal value in consideration of the estate of the estate which he has received by her for the support of herself and children born now and such as may be hereafter born the issue of this marriage. At our therefore this deed witnesseth that in consideration of the premises and the further sum of one dollar in hand paid the said Thomas J. Burbage doth grant unto the said John W. Halstead Trustee the following property real and personal to wit: all the said Thomas J. Burbage's right, title and interest to a certain tract of land lying in Southampton known as the Pittstown tract containing by estimate 700 acres more or less bounded on the West by the lands of Thomas Groff and Richard Barrett, North and East by the Black Water River and South by the lands of Lawrence Gardner and others. The boundaries more fully to be ascertained by reference to a deed from Cornell and Beards to Joshua Problow and Joseph B. Crumpler from whom the said Burbage purchased the said tract of land. Three horses, two cows, thirty hogs, twenty-four sheep and the future increase of the stock, and all the farming implements on the said plantation. On trust for the following uses and purposes to wit. The said trustee is to hold the property above said during the joint lives of the said Burbage and Annie his wife for the sole and separate use and support of the said Annie O' Burbage and the issue of their marriage free from the debts and control of the said Thomas J. Burbage, at the death of the said Thomas J. Burbage should his wife be then living then for the use and support of the said Annie O' Burbage and the children issue of the said marriage during his widowhood should she marry him to the use and support of the children issue of their marriage.
