This deed made and entered into this the thirteenth day of April in the year of our Lord one thousand eight hundred and sixty five (1865) between George A. Holliman and Octavia his wife of the County of Shenandoah State of Virginia of the first part and John Crumpler of the County of Southampton State of Virginia, With respect to that the said George A. Holliman and Octavia his wife parties of the first part in consideration of the sum of two hundred and twenty dollars do hereby grant and convey unto the said John Crumpler of the second part, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and bounded as follows One the West by Seacock Swamp on the North by said Crumplers land, on the South by said Crumplers land known as the "Water tract" on the East by the road leading from the Proctors Road to Durr Depots intersected by A. P. Road together with all the rights, liberties, privileges and appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging To have and to hold the said tract of land unto the said John Crumpler his heirs and assigns forever And the said George A. Holliman and Octavia his wife do warrant generally the property conveyed. Witness the following signatures and seals the day and year above written.

This deed made this 14th day of April in the year 1866 between James D. Bryant of the one part and Thomas J. Proctor and James F. Bryant of the other part, With respect to that the said James D. Bryant do hereby grant unto the said Thomas J. Proctor & James F. Bryant the following property, to wit, a certain tract or parcel of land lying and being in the County of Southampton being the same on which he now resides, containing by estimation twelve hundred acres, more or less and bounded by the lands of Thomas J. Proctor, W. W. Briggs, Jonathan Darden & others, also the following personal property, to wit, his stock of horses, mules, cattle, hogs and sheep, one carriage and harness, one buggy & harness, one Wagon & gear, carts, cart wheels & cart gear, all his household and kitchen furniture of every description, cooking utensils and farming implements of every description - it is not however intended to convey any articles of property as are excepted from sale by or by under the 33rd & 34th Sections of Chapter 29 of the Code of Virginia 1860, and they are hereby expressly excepted - In trust to secure the payment of the debts of the said James D. Bryant as herein after provided, that to wit, the debt due James W. Proctor by bond the 18th June 1860, for six hundred & ninety five (\$95) dollars and seven cents interest thereon, and a debt due Jonathan Darden, by bond the 21st May 1860 for five hundred and thirty three, 533 1/2 dollars with interest thereon, subject to the following credits, to wit, for \$111.98^{1/2} paid May 21st 1862 \$26.17^{1/2} paid March 19th 1866 of \$305.31^{1/2} paid April 7th 1866 - these debts stand on an equal footing and are first to be paid - After which the following debts are next to be paid if found sufficient for that purpose, if not they are to be pro-rated, to wit, a debt due James S. Pope by bond, date not recalled, to W. W. Briggs in security, for about one hundred dollars - a debt due Robt. A. Dale by bond, date not recalled, to W. W.
