Conditioned That for the consideration of three thousand dollars in hand paid to them the said Penow and Narcissa his wife doth bargain and sell to the aforesaid R. Barrett all of their right, title and interest in a certain lot of land lying on the North Side of the Seaboard and Roanoke Railroad, in the village of Franklin Depot, and in the County and State aforesaid, known as the "Edmund Hotel" lot, which the said Penow bought of James A. Bell. The said Penow warrants the title generally to the aforesaid Barrett his heirs and assigns forever. Given under our hands and seals this day and date above written.

Ex- 4 This Deed made this 30<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year one thousand eight hundred and sixty six thousand delivered to C. H. Kimball and his wife C. Antoinette Kimball of the first part and Miles Worrall (grantee) of the other part, witnesseth, that the said Kimball (debtors) for and in consideration of the sum of thirty dollars by the said grantee paid to the said grantor, the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged, do grant and convey to the said Miles Worrall, a tract or parcel of land lately cut off from the said Kimball farm lying near Newson's Depot on the Roanoke & Seaboard Rail Road, which is supposed to contain thirty acres more or less, and is bounded by a marked line of pines, beginning at a big pine (a corner between the said Kimball and Sally Johnson), near the said Rail Road, on the path leading from the said Rail Road to the sign post where the roads leading to "Vicks Church" and Barnes' meeting house fork - the said line between the said Kimball and the said Worrall along the path or near it being marked by pines trees and running nearly in a straight line to the said sign post - and from thence along the County road towards Barnes' meeting house or Penny Grove, about two hundred yards to a big pine marked, and standing near a ditch - and from the said big pine in a straight line to a red oak tree marked and standing near the branch, near the point where the said Kimball formerly had a gate - this includes the land (the woodland) lying next to the said Worrall's land, and cut off from that purchased by the said Kimball from Edward Bristow and the said grantor's grant and convey further to the said Worrall the uninterrupted right of way at all times along the path leading from the sign post to the said Rail Road.
