Contract between J. Crumpler & J. Profflow & J. I. Burdage. J. Jos. B. Crumpler & Joshua Profflow doth bargain & sell to J. I. Burdage on certain parcel or tract of land known as Pittstown and formerly owned by Cornell Means of Sum. for the sum of five thousand four hundred dollars, all the parties together with two Mills one hitherto large and a lot of cider casks used by us to store cider in. The said J. I. Burdage agrees to pay one half cash by the first of Jan. 1866 and to give three notes of nine hundred dollars each payable on the first of Jan. 1867, 1868 & 1869 with interest until paid, upon the payment of which we promise to bind ourselves to make a clear title guaranteed against all claims of every kind. Signed this the twenty eighth of September 1865.

Witnesseth: that the said grantors for and in consideration of the sum of five thousand and five hundred dollars (\$5500.00 cents) the receipt of which sum is hereby acknowledged to be this day paid to them, do hereby grant and convey to the said E. C. Magot that tract or parcel of land lying in said County and bounded on the north by the lands of Benjamin Applewhite, Elijah Adams and the three creeks, on the East by Mrs. Georgiana Smith and Robert Bradley's estate, on the south by Joseph H.
