This deed made this 14<sup>th</sup> day of April in the year 1866, between Robert C. Whitehead and William H. Whitehead of the one part and John G. Weeks of the other part. Witnesseth, that the said Robert C. Whitehead and William H. Whitehead doth grant unto the said John G. Weeks the following property to wit: One horse, one horse-cart and wheels, two beds and furniture. Also trust to secure to Fortunatus Dunn a debt due by bond bearing date and due the 14<sup>th</sup> day of April 1866, for Eightyfour dollars and twenty three cents with interest from date until paid, and also to secure the said Fortunatus Dunn as security to a bond due by us for sixty eight dollars and ninety cents to Samuel Hille Sheriff and administrator of George Mitchell dec<sup>d</sup>. in a debt due by bond and bearing date the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1866 and due the 3<sup>d</sup> day of January 1867, with interest from the 3<sup>d</sup> day of April 1866 until paid and the said John G. Weeks trustee is to sell the said property herebefore mentioned on notice of either party for cash and after satisfying said bonds and all costs thereof, the balance if any, to the said Robert C. This Indenture made this 20<sup>th</sup> day of April 1866, between E. B. Barrott and Richard Barrott and Mary R. his wife of the County of Southampton, State of Virginia of the first part and Spikes Beale of the County of Wight and State aforesaid of the other part, Conditioned, for the consideration of eight hundred dollars in specie paid to them by the said Beale, they do bargain and sell to the said Beale all their right title and interest in a piece or parcel of land known as a part of the tract of land called the Crumpler tract, bounded as follows commencing at the North West corner of the Gobletown tract at a black gum near the big ditch which is a corner between Gobletown tract and the said Barrotts land and running up the big ditch along a line of marked trees to what is known as the crib field, thence down the line of the crib field along a line of marked trees to a white oak in J. Goble's line, thence down that line in southerly direction to R. T. Barrott's line, thence down the same line of marked trees to M. Hollands line, thence Easterly along the said Holland line to a ditch between said Beale and Holland, thence in the same direction along the ditch or slash to what is called the school house branch, thence down the said branch in a southerly direction to the mouth of the ditch between the said Beale and the Gobletown tract, thence up the said ditch along a line of marked trees to the beginning, containing one hundred and twenty eight acres, more or less. The site and title we the said E. B. Barrott and Richard Barrott and Mary R. his wife warrant generally. Given under our hands and seals this day and date above written.
