 Westa Pope of the first part and Job Holland of the second part, both of the County of Southampton.  
 Whereas, that in the consideration of the sum of two hundred dollars the said Westa Pope do grant unto  
 the said Job Holland, with general warranty all of that tract or parcel of land, known as the Johnson  
 tract containing One hundred acres more or less, lying in the County of Southampton and bounded as  
 follows, to wit, On the North by the lands of Westa Pope, on the East, by the lands of Exum Bryant, the  
 said West and heirs of Jas. Horrell dec<sup>d</sup>, on the South by the lands of Job Holland and on the West by the

 Chas. I. Kindred of the first part and Benjamin B. Kindred of the other part. Whereas one  
 William Joyner, died in the year 1856 or thereabouts executed a Deed of trust to the said Chas. I. Kindred granting  
 and conveying a certain tract of land therein described for the purpose of bearing the payment of a certain debt  
 to the said B. B. Kindred which said debt was due for the purchase of the said tract of land. And whereas  
 it became necessary to sell the same by virtue of the said Deed of trust, and the said B. B. Kindred became the  
 purchaser. Now this said Westa Pope, that the said Chas. I. Kindred, for and in consideration of the  
 premises and the sum of three thousand dollars paid to the said Chas. I. Kindred by the said B. B. Kindred,

 one hundred and fifty acres, more or less, and bounded by Taryar or Creek, the land of Everett Bryant & W.  
 Tyler Bryant and others. It being the same on which the said B. B. Kindred now resides. And the said  
 Chas. I. Kindred, as trustee as aforesaid, warrants specially the property hereby granted and conveyed.
