Barrett, (grantor) doth hereby grant and convey to the said Wm W Briggs the following property, to wit, one pair of black horses, one chestnut sorrel stallion, one pair of sorrel mules, stock of hogs, about eighty or ninety head, and their increase, all his stock of cattle, eight head and increase, all the farming implements (including four carts and wheels) of every kind now in possession of the said Barrett, one buggy, harness, one sulky and harness, all the household and kitchen furniture now in possession of the said Barrett, one gold watch, and all the growing crops now in possession of the said Barrett, viz. cotton, corn, soaker, peas, potatoes &c.
