Robinson of the County of Greenville, all of the State of Virginia, Witnesseth, that in consideration of five hundred dollars to wit, the said Joseph H. Prince and Elizabeth B. his wife do grant unto the said William J. Robinson all their right and title to one hundred and fifty acres land lying in the Counties of Greenville and Southampton and bounded as follows: commencing at a small hickory in the line between said Prince and the land of David Prince do: running thence to a small oak thence to a large pine in Ezekiel Fox's line thence to a small Sweet gum, thence to an oak near the spring, thence to a Sweet gum, thence down the river of the large branch to the public road (leading to Jonestown) thence along said road to said Robinsons line, thence a or straight line to the beginning.
