This deed made the 19th day of June 1866 between Wm. H. Dinsmore & Robert E. Whitehead of the first part and John G. Weeks of the second part, Trustee, M^tneypeth, that the said Wm. H. Dinsmore & Whitehead of the first part do grant with special warranty unto the said John G. Weeks, Trustee, the following property to wit: One grey Lame barrel mare, one cow & calf, Edwin's hogs, our farming implements of every description, five feather beds of furniture, our household & kitchen furniture, our entire wheat in the crop of barley for the present year, one calf of corn, fodder, stacks of potatoes on hand and the crop of peas. In trust, to secure the payment of one note executed to Fortunatus Dunn on the 16th April 1866 & on demand with interest from date of execution for Eighty four dollars 75/100 also to secure the said Fortunatus Dunn as security for us in a debt due Sam'lHello Sheriff & Admin on the last of Geo Mitchell due by note executed 24th May 1866 and payable on January 3rd 1867 amounting to about Sixty nine dollars with int. thence from the day of execution, also to secure to Fortunatus Dunn & Drury, Turner & Ross equally the payment of two bonds, one executed on the 19th June 1866 for fifty two 75/100 dollars with int. from date due to Fortunatus Dunn, the other due to Drury, Turner & Ross for fifty two 75/100 executed on the 15th June 1866 with int. from date of execution also to secure jointly Fortunatus Dunn & Drury, Turner & Ross the payment of a bond executed to them on the 19th June 1866 amounting to Eighty dollars bearing interest from date also to secure the payment of a note executed to Jas. H. Dinsmore on 23rd May 1866 for eighteen dollars due 23rd May 1866 with interest thereon from date. Also a written obligation for twelve barrels corn to be delivered on the first of Nov. next or its equivalent in currency at the time above mentioned also to secure to James E. Peters at the same date the payment of three barrels Corn & one thousand pounds fodder, also to secure to Wm Prince the payment of an open account for ten dollars also the payment of an account due Thos. R. Powell amounting to thirty one dollars - Witness our signatures and seals -
