This deed made the 19th day of June 1866 between Wm. A. Whithead & Robert E. Whithead of the first part and John B. Weeks of the second part, Trustees, Witnessed, that the said Wm. A. & Robt. E. Whitheads of the first part, do grant with special warranty unto the said John B. Weeks Trustee, the following property, to wit. One gray & one brown mare, one cow & calf, eleven hogs, our farming implements of every description, five feather beds of furniture, our household & kitchen furniture, our entire interest in the crop of corn, for the present year, our crop of corn, fodder, truck & potatoes on hand and the crop of peas. We Trust, to secure the payment of our note executed to Fortunatus Dunn on the 16th April 1866 & on demand with interest from date of execution for eighty four dollars 73/100 also to secure the said Fortunatus Dunn as security for us in a debt due Saml. Wells Sheriff & Adminr on the last of his Mitchell dec. by note executed April 3rd 1866 and payable on January 3rd 1867 amounting to about sixty nine dollars with int. thereon from the day of execution, also to secure to Fortunatus Dunn & Drury, Turner 1866. Equally the payment of two bonds, one executed on the 19th June 1866 for fifty two 7/100 dollars with int. from date due to Fortunatus Dunn, the other due to Drury, Turner 1866 for fifty two 7/100 executed on the 15th June 1866 with int. from date of execution, also to secure jointly Fortunatus Dunn & Drury, Turner 1866 the payment of a bond executed to them on the 19th June 1866 amounting to eighty dollars bearing interest from date - also to secure the payment of a note executed to Jas. H. Drury on 23rd May 1866 for eighty dollars due 23rd May 1866 with interest thereon from date - Also a written obligation for twelve barrels corn to be delivered on the first of Nov. next or its equivalent in currency at the time above mentioned also to secure to James E. Peters at the same date, the payment of four barrels Corn & one thousand pounds fodder, also to secure to Wm. Prince the payment of an account for ten dollars - also the payment of an account due Thos. R. Bond amounting to thirty one dollars - Witness our signatures and seals -
